Notice is hereby given that Car Duibh Wind Farm Limited, a company incorporated under the Companies Act with company number 12820057 and having its registered office at 19th Floor 22 Bishopsgate, London, United Kingdom, EC2N 4BQ has applied to the Scottish Ministers for consent under Section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 to construct and operate the An Càrr Dubh Wind Farm (“the proposed Development”) in between Inveraray to the South-East and Dalavich to the North-West (Central Grid Reference NN 04004 10793). It will have a generating capacity exceeding 50MW and will comprise of up to 13 turbines with maximum ground to blade tip heights of up to 180 metres. The proposed Development is subject to Environmental Impact Assessment and the applicant has had an Environmental Impact Assessment report (“EIA report”) produced.

Car Duibh Wind Farm Limited has also applied for a direction under Section 57(2) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 that planning permission for the proposed Development be deemed to be granted.

A copy of the application, with a plan showing the land to which it relates, together with a copy of the EIA report discussing the Company’s proposals in more detail and presenting an analysis of the environmental implications, are available for public inspection in person, free of charge, during normal office hours at:

All representations should be received not later than the date falling 30 days from the date of the last print publication of this notice not including public holidays (said print publication is Argyllshire Advertiser with last publication date as being Friday 21st April 2023), although the Scottish Ministers may consider representations received after this date.

Any subsequent additional information which is submitted by the Company will be subject to further public notice in this manner, and representations to such information will be accepted as per this notice.

As a result of a statutory objection from the relevant planning authority, or where the Scottish Ministers decide to exercise their discretion to do so, Scottish Ministers can also cause a Public Inquiry to be held.

Following examination of the environmental information, the Scottish Ministers will determine the application for consent in two ways:

- grant consent to the proposed Development, with or without conditions attached; or
- reject the application.
